Bowling Party with Everyone on our Teams




-After the presentation, we had a Dinner/Farewell to mentors at the Bowling Center

Magic gardens


- Isaiah Zagar's artistic visions collaborated with artwork around the world created a beautiful environment in the center of Philadelphia
